Building Bridges Across Boundaries: Presbyterian Retreat for everybody Friday May 9 - Saturday May 10 at Camp Whitman on Seneca Lake



This retreat is open for ministers and church members of the PC(USA) in the seven presbyteries of the Upstate NY network: Albany, Cayuga-Syracuse, Genesee Valley, Geneva, Northern New York, Susquehanna Valley, and Utica. We are especially encouraging ministers, commissioned ruling elders, lay preachers, congregational leaders, and presbytery committee members to attend.

Overnight with 3 meals (Friday dinner, Saturday breakfast & lunch), with optional Friday lunch. Objective is to have fun while getting to know each other across the Presbyteries of Upstate New York.

Cottage-style cabins \$95/person:

Hawk and Loon Cottages — each sleeps 4, with electricity and one bathroom.
Osprey and Heron Cottages — each sleeps 6 (three BR), with electricity and one bathroom.
Walnut Cabin — sleeps 12 in a studio room with electricity. No water, adjacent to Main Lodge for bathroom facilities.

Rustic cabins \$70/person: Cabins (28 available) — Each cabin includes four beds. Some without electricity, none with water. Restroom facilities include well-maintained portapotties as well as a shower house with showers, flush toilets, and sinks.

Commuter option \$40/person: includes 3 meals. Make your own arrangements to stay overnight off-site. A block rate is being set up at the Days Inn Geneva (25 minutes away), or check other lodging options in and around Penn Yan, Watkins Glen, and Geneva.

This is a camp so you will need to bring your own bedding, flashlight, and a camp chair. Please bring your own snack and beverage [alcohol is permitted] for gathering after vespers.

Check-in begins 12pm Friday, with opening program at 1pm. Other programs will be some team-building, campfire, sing-along, and arts and crafts.

Presbytery of Susquehanna Valley Camperships supporting and enhancing kids' Christian faith journeys

The Presbytery of Susquehanna Valley's campership program is open for applications beginning February 1. Campership funds are offered to all school-age students (Kindergarten through 12th grade) and also to adults with developmental disabilities.

Camperships are provided to ALL families (regardless of family income) involved in churches in the presbytery, to promote Christian faith formation experiences for K-12 students. They are an incentive, not a "financial aid" program.

Camperships are available for Christian summer camp programs of any length up to one week long. This can be an overnight program, a day program, or a virtual program. The presbytery will pay up to 75% of the cost of a one-week program at a PC(USA) camp, to a maximum of \$575 per camper. Lesser awards are offered for non-PC(USA) camps. Presbytery of Susquehanna Valley Faith Formation Scholarship supporting church members and sessions in attending spiritual and congregational vitality conferences and workshops

The Faith Formation Scholarship is offered to all congregations in a spirit of generosity, in hopes that you will seek good opportunities.

The Faith Formation Scholarship offers substantial support of the registration fees for church conferences and programs — up to 75% for programs from PC(USA) groups like seminaries, Montreat, or the Stony Point Center; less for programs from ecumenical partner denominations or other Christian programs. We ask that you also request support from your own session, but their support is not a requirement to receive ours.

PC(USA)'s Stated Clerk and Executive Director wants Presbyterians to know about recent efforts to make civil society less disruptive

In a news release this week, the Rev. Jihyun Oh wrote to us as siblings in the PC(USA):

"In recent days, we have seen the disruption of so many norms in our life together as a civil society within the U.S. Among those disruptions are the negation of those places we have thought of as protected spaces, those "sensitive locations," where children can learn and play and people have their needs met, including needs for food and shelter, and where all can worship God and practice their faith and find community. Many of you have been wondering whether the denomination is doing anything."

Get Involved!
