

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# Welcome to the Celebration! July 6, 2025 • 10:00am

In today's lesson, the disciples continue the work of preaching, exorcism and healing at the Jerusalem temple, and they become so popular that crowds of people clog the way to Solomon's Porch. The temple authorities have the disciples arrested again, and summon the council to bring them to trial. When the council members arrive at the prison, they discover that the Spirit has freed the disciples, who have returned to the temple and continued their work. They are re-arrested and brought before the council, but a teacher named Gamaliel intercedes, pointing out that punishing the disciples may cause civil unrest, so the council flogs them and lets them go.


Holy God,

# We Tell and Hear the Word

# FOCUS LESSON Acts 5:12-42, CEB

Summary of vv. 12–32: The apostles continued to preach and to heal in the temple, gaining in popularity, and crowds grew as people came from the surrounding areas. The religious leaders, particularly the Sadducees, were filled with jealousy and had the apostles arrested, but an angel freed them from prison. The apostles were brought before the Jerusalem Council, where they boldly declared their commitment to obeying God rather than human authorities.

<sup>33</sup> When the council members heard this, they became furious and wanted to kill the apostles. <sup>34</sup>One council member, a Pharisee and teacher of the Law named Gamaliel, well-respected by all the people, stood up and ordered that the men be taken outside for a few moments. <sup>35</sup> He said, "Fellow Israelites, consider carefully what you intend to do to these people. <sup>36</sup> Some time ago, Theudas appeared, claiming to be somebody, and some four hundred men joined him. After he was killed, all of his followers scattered, and nothing came of that. <sup>37</sup> Afterward, at the time of the census, Judas the Galilean appeared and got some people to follow him in a revolt. He was killed too, and all his followers scattered far and wide. <sup>38</sup> Here's my recommendation in this case: Distance yourselves from these men. Let them go! If their plan or activity is of human origin, it will end in ruin. <sup>39</sup> If it originates with God, you won't be able to stop them. Instead, you would actually find yourselves fighting God!" The council was convinced by his reasoning. <sup>40</sup> After calling the apostles back, they had them beaten. They ordered them not to speak in the name of Jesus, then let them go. <sup>41</sup> The apostles left the council rejoicing because they had been regarded as worthy to suffer disgrace for the sake of the name. 42 Every day they continued to teach and proclaim the good news that Jesus is the Christ, both in the temple and in houses.



# **Gathering at the Lord's Table** — Our Communion Elements:

We are celebrating communion during today's worship service. Our communion bread is gluten-free, and our shared cup is cherry juice, so that all may partake of the same elements during our communion. Please speak to one of the technicians at the back of the sanctuary if this creates any difficulties for you.

We are glad that your children are here today, and we hope that you know that they are welcome and encouraged to be in worship with you. We truly believe that a community of faith is made up of people of ALL ages. There is a PrayGround space with coloring sheets and quiet toys in the front of the sanctuary to use there or can be taken to another pew, if that suits your family's needs.

There is a nursery for infants through age four staffed with two nursery attendants, if that is a better choice for your family. The nursery is at the end of the hall past the bathrooms. Nursery staff are on duty from 9:00am to 12:00pm. Parents are welcome to stay in the room and listen to the service over the speaker, or to return to the sanctuary to worship.
