## Welcome to the Celebration! September 14, 2025 • 10:00am

Last Sunday, we heard about a king in Israel who did not lead the people to love and serve God. This week we are hearing a story about a new king in Judah, who was determined to turn things around for his people. He started by working to restore the temple to its former glory. The people who were working on the temple found a scroll containing the words of the covenant between God and God's people. He called together the whole community and read the words to them; the people of Judah recommitted themselves to the covenant relationship and disaster was averted for a little while. Today we are giving Bibles to our second graders and installing new officers during our service, so it is a good time to think about what it means to have a loving covenant relationship with our God.

#### We Tell and Hear the Word

#### TIME FOR THE YOUNG AT HEART

Focus Lesson 2 Kings 22:1–13; 23:1–3, CEB

**22** 1 Josiah was eight years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem thirty-one years. His mother's name was Jedidah daughter of Adaiah; she was from Bozkath. <sup>2</sup> He did what was right in the eyes of the LORD and followed completely the ways of his father David, not turning aside to the right or to the left.

<sup>3</sup> In the eighteenth year of his reign, King Josiah sent the secretary, Shaphan son of Azaliah, the son of Meshullam, to the temple of the LORD. He said: <sup>4</sup> "Go up to Hilkiah the high priest and have him get ready the money that has been brought into the temple of the LORD, which the doorkeepers have collected from the people. <sup>5</sup> Have them entrust it to the men appointed to supervise the work on the temple. And have these men pay the workers who repair the temple of the LORD — <sup>6</sup> the carpenters, the builders and the masons. Also have them purchase timber and dressed stone to repair the temple. <sup>7</sup> But they need not account for the money entrusted to them, because they are honest in their dealings."

<sup>8</sup> Hilkiah the high priest said to Shaphan the secretary, "I have found the Book of the Law in the temple of the LORD." He gave it to Shaphan, who read it. <sup>9</sup> Then Shaphan the secretary went to the king and reported to him: "Your officials have paid out the money that was in the temple of the LORD and have entrusted it to the workers and supervisors at the temple." <sup>10</sup> Then Shaphan the secretary informed the king, "Hilkiah the priest has given me a book." And Shaphan read from it in the presence of the king.

<sup>11</sup> When the king heard the words of the Book of the Law, he tore his robes. <sup>12</sup> He gave these orders to Hilkiah the priest, Ahikam son of Shaphan, Akbor son of Micaiah, Shaphan the secretary, and Asaiah the king's attendant: <sup>13</sup> "Go and inquire of the LORD for me and for the people and for all Judah about what is written in this book that has been found. Great is the LORD's anger that burns against us because those who have gone before us have not obeyed the words of this book; they have not acted in accordance with all that is written there concerning us."

23 ¹ Then the king called together all the elders of Judah and Jerusalem. ² He went up to the temple of the LORD with the people of Judah, the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the priests and the prophets — all the people from the least to the greatest. He read in their hearing all the words of the Book of the Covenant, which had been found in the temple of the LORD. ³ The king stood by the pillar and renewed the covenant in the presence of the LORD — to follow the LORD and keep his commands, statutes, and decrees with all his heart and all his soul, thus confirming the words of the covenant written in this book. Then all the people pledged themselves to the covenant.

#### **CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTIONS**

Book of Order, W-4.0404

#### The moderator or minister addresses those who are to be installed:

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? **I do.** 

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you? **I do.** 

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God? I do and I will.

Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions? **I will.** 

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit? I will.

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world? **I will.** 

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church? I do.

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? **I will.** 

Will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ? **I will.** 

## A ruling elder of the church addresses the congregation:

Do we, the members of the church, accept Lou, Matt, Margaret, and Sally as ruling elders, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ? **We do.** 

Do we agree to pray for them, to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church? **We will.**

Be faithful and true in your ministry so that your whole life will bear witness to the crucified and risen Christ. Amen!


#### SHARING OF CHRIST'S PEACE


